

The Texas Heartbeat Act is an act of the Texas Legislature, which was signed into law on May 19, 2021, and went into effect on September 1, 2021. It is the first six-week abortion ban in the United States, and the first of its kind to rely on civil rather than criminal enforcement. The Center for Reproductive Rights filed an emergency motion before the Supreme Court of the United States on August 30, 2021, seeking to block the Act. In a 5–4 vote, the Supreme Court denied the motion before the September 1, 2021 commencement date, and subsequently the Act came into force.

How Ohio's Heartbeat Bill Paved the Way for Ohio's First Sanctuary City for the Unborn

On May 25th, 2021, Lebanon, Ohio became the first city in the state to become a Sanctuary City for the Unborn. After a unanimous vote, the Lebanon City Council passed an ordinance that outlawed abortion in their city and declared abortion-inducing drugs contraband.

The Sanctuary City for the Unborn (SCU) movement, first conceived in Texas, has sparked a national response. At the time of this article's publication, thirty cities across the U.S. have designated themselves Sanctuary Cities for the Unborn. Lebanon's ordinance represents a groundbreaking moment in the movement's history: it is the first city in Ohio to enact such an ordinance and geographically, the farthest east. All other Sanctuary Cities for the Unborn have been localized to states west of the Mississippi— namely, Texas and Nebraska. A handful of cities in other states, emboldened by the movement's success, are also looking to pass such ordinances in their communities.

Why Chemical Abortion Regulations Must Be a Pro-Life Priority

Ohio's abortion numbers have dropped drastically over the last decade. Half of Ohio's abortion facilities have closed, and our abortion rate has decreased by over 30%. The pro-life movement has gained unprecedented ground in Ohio. However, a closer look at Ohio's abortion statistics show a startling trend. The number of chemical abortions in Ohio-and across the rest of the U.S.- is skyrocketing. As surgical abortions have become no longer financially lucrative, the abortion industry has pivoted to focus increasingly on chemical abortions. As the abortion industry pivots to push the abortion pill by any means necessary, it becomes even more imperative that the pro-life movement prioritize our fight against chemical abortions.
