In this counter amendment, Florida Right to Life concurs with Susan D. Cutaia, President of Citizens for Science and Ethics, Inc. when she states, *"NO to state funding for experiments that involve the destruction of a live human embryo. We view this ballot initiative as a perfect compromise that allows current public funding to pursue promising research in Adult Stem Cell (ASC) while at the same time creating a standard that does not disenfranchise the many taxpayers of this state who find some forms of experimentation unethical and immoral."*

A great majority of Floridians are uneducated in the varied methods certain types of stem cell research and that many people do not know that there has been no results with Embryonic Stem Cell (ESC) research. The facts are that Adult Stem Cells (ASC) are currently in 250 trial clinics working on 80 different diseases and carry the best promise of cures. Adult Stem Cell research poses no ethical or moral issues.

The real promise of stem cell research can be achieved through ASC, umbilical cord blood stem cells, and placental-derived stem cells. The Constitutional Amendment we seek does not preclude private or federal funding for any form of research.
