Dear Pro-Life Friends,

On this Monday, July 31 at 10:10 am, Scott Thomas will have another hearing to decide his fate. His wife, who previously desired to have his feeding tube removed, is fighting for co-guardianship of him. For those of you not familiar with Scott, you can read his story and see photos and video at [www.scottsfight.com](http://www.scottsfight.com). His wife has asked for extra time to present her case before the judge, in order to convince him that Scott's decisions and care should be shared by her and his mom. Under Florida law, the wife is given the pre-eminence in making decisions, so she would actually then have MORE power than Scott's mom, who has been battling to keep him safe from his "wife" for nearly two years now.

If Liza (the "wife") were to gain co-guardianship, she would be able to remove Scott from his mom's home, take him to a nursing home, and then proceed to direct his care, or refuse care as she most likely would.

Scott is no longer receiving any tube feedings while in his mother's care! She takes the time each day to prepare all his meals and feed him. His mom is an inspiring woman - giving her all to care for him and make sure that he gets the therapy that he needs. Giving Liza co-guardianship will put Scott at risk of his life.

Please join us in prayer for Scott and his mom Pamela as they go before the judge on Monday. Please pray that there will be final resolution for them, so that they can go forward with his therapy, without the constant stress of this custody battle. May the judge have wisdom and discernment to see that Liza means to cause harm to Scott, and permanently remove her from the situation.

Remember, there has been a precedent set in Florida. Please pray that Scott will not be the next victim.

### **Schiavo Foundation Steps Into Local Feeding Tube Fight**

JACKSONVILLE, FL -- 34-year old Scott Thomas married Liza Thomas in 2001. They bought a home and had a baby boy. But one September day, paramedics found Scott on his kitchen floor with several hairline fractures down the left side of his head. Scott spent two months in a coma.

Scott's mom, Pamela Patton, says Liza had plans to put Scott in Community Hospice of Northeast Florida, so she filed for temporary guardianship in November and won. For months, Pamela took care of Scott in her home, and worked with him every day. "He watches you, he listens, he smiles, he cries," said Patton. Six weeks ago, Scott's trach was removed. Now he's in Brooks Rehabilitation.

Meanwhile, the clock is ticking. Patton's guardianship could end in a few weeks. Patton fears Liza will remove Scott's feeding tube.

The Terri Schindler-Schiavo Foundation has stepped in. "They don't wish to poke their noses into somebody else's business, but they do want to plead to this woman to please think about what she's doing," said Pamela Hennessy, spokeswoman for the Terri Schindler-Schiavo Foundation. The Foundation is urging DCF to investigate the circumstances surrounding Scott's injuries.

According to Patton, Liza says Scott fell in the kitchen, but doctors tell Scott's mother his injuries are consistent with a head trauma, not a fall. Whether Liza gets control is up to a judge, but until then, Scott's room sits ready.

"If his wife doesn't want him to live, then just let him go because we want him," said Patton. Scott does not have a living will. Liza would not comment Monday.
